y nearly every metric, Tracy Lawrence is a mega-watt success story. Thirteen million albums sold. A collection of No. 1 singles. Twenty-two songs on the Billboard Top 10 charts. A slew of CMA and ACM awards. Even a Grammy nomination. Yes, the small-town Arkansas-bred teenager who arrived in Nashville nearly three decades ago with a guitar and \$700 in his pocket has done himself proud. Don't remind him, though. Because despite it all, the "Sticks and Stones" icon has always felt it important to maintain a steadfast workmanlike approach to and sheer reverence for his craft. "I still see myself as that kid that came to town and idolized Merle Haggard and George Strait," says Lawrence, who is set to release his most ambitious album of his career on November 10th titled GOOD OLE DAYS. The new album celebrates the music legend's indelible mark on country music featuring a selection of his most iconic hits performed as a duet with some of Country and Rock's contemporary superstars and newcomers including Jason Aldean, Big & Rich, Luke Bryan, Luke Combs, Easton Corbin, Dustin Lynch, Tim McGraw, Justin Moore, Kellie Pickler and Chris Young.

In addition to touring with his band and launching a brand new album, the country music super-star is also host to the weekly syndicated radio show, "Honky Tonkin' With Tracy Lawrence." Earlier this year, Lawrence received an Academy of Country Music Radio Awards nomination for National On-Air Personality of the Year for the show. Conceived and developed by Lawrence, "Honky Tonkin" focuses on the music and artists of the 80s, 90s and early-2000s. "I just felt there was such a void in the market because there really wasn't anybody focusing on the music from my era," he explains. "The industry had missed the fact that so many people and not just the people that had grown up with us, but their kids and younger people too — are getting into it now."

On Saturday, October 21st the country music star will take the historic Marion Palace Theatre stage. Fans will experience a legendary performance as Lawrence performs his top hits including "Sticks and Stones," "Can't Break it to My Heart," "Alibis," "My Second Home," "If the Good Die Young," "Texas Tornado," "Paint Me A Birmingham," "Time Marches On," and "Find Out Who Your Friends Are."
