
Cooke is looking for boys ages 10 and up, girls ages 14 and up, and adults to fill various ensemble and featured roles in the production. Auditions will be

Each auditioner is asked to come prepared to sing a one-minute Broadway-style audition tune. A pianist will be provided. No CDs please. Those interested in a principle role should also be prepared to read from the script. All auditioners should come dressed in casual

Get ready for a night of rockabilly, country, gospel, and pure 1950's rock and roll on Friday, May 4 at the Marion Palace Theatre. One Night in Memphis takes you back to one night in 1956, when four of the biggest names in early rock and roll – Elvis Presley, Carl Perkins, Jerry Lee Lewis and Johnny Cash – gathered together for an impromptu jam session at the legendary Sun Studios in Memphis.

Featuring acclaimed national talent with an uncanny sound, look, and feel of the original legends, you'll see and hear Carl Perkins performing hits like Honey Don't, Brown-Eyed Handsome Man, and Blue Suede Shoes. Jerry Lee Lewis' set includes High School Confidential, Breathless, Whole Lotta Shaking Goin' On, and Great Balls of Fire. Johnny Cash performs smash hits like Folsom Prison Blues, Ring of Fire, and I Walk the Line. Elvis will close out the night with his electrifying hits like Shake, Rattle & Roll, All Shook Up, Heartbreak Hotel, Don't be Cruel, and Hound Dog.

One Night in Memphis: Presley, Perkins, Lewis & Cash tributes a night in history that still lives on today. On December 4th, 1956, Carl Perkins, along with his brothers Clayton and Jay booked a recording session at Sam Phillip's Sun Records Studios in Memphis,

Tennessee. He was to record an old blues song called "Matchbox" that the Beatles covered as well years later. On the session was a young and cocky piano player from Ferriday, Louisiana by the name of Jerry Lee Lewis. Not long after they got a satisfactory take, Elvis Presley dropped by (a big star already) and listened in. Johnny Cash dropped in as well. A jam session then ensued and the engineer that day kept the tape rolling without the knowledge of anyone. The jam session went on for quite a while and at some point during the night Phillips called the Memphis Press Scimitar newspaper. They came by and shot some photos. The next day an article appeared about the memorable occasion under the headline of "Million Dollar Quartet." What survives today is a recording of an event that is a momentous eavesdropping on American recording artist icons in their prime; Elvis Presley, Carl Perkins, Jerry Lee Lewis, and Johnny Cash all having the time of their life singing country, gospel, and rock and roll songs.

The Merit of the Arts

I often extol the merit of the arts. It's easy to do. I see the benefits first hand every day. I am the happy recipient of the stories created for those who participate. Chances are most of you don't have the same vantage point as I do, and perhaps that leaves the merit of the arts up for debate in your minds. talent at the table when we accept

I hope to help settle the debate for you, if there is one.

In an article I was recently reading, the author made the point that the value of subjects like science, technology, math, and even sports is rarely in question. No need to question the worth of subjects with tangible or measurable results, right? The proof is in the numbers – test scores or wins and losses. We applaud things like the mastermind behind the latest, greatest app or the 3 pointer made at the buzzer to win the game. And, rightfully so. There is data to quantify the value of such studies and activities.

But many see involvement in the arts as optional. Expendable. Maybe even irrelevant. Why?

Is it that we, as a culture, haven't seen numbers to verify the value and the outcomes of involvement in the arts? Often arts related outcomes are viewed as intangible versus the very tangible things I mentioned above.

confidence, conquering the fear of public speaking, collaboration and team-building, the art of memorization, industry in America is a \$730 billion the discipline of time management, or the celebration of our differences because cumulatively there is more each other for the unique people we are. These may not be measurable in the same manner but these are the results of participation in the arts.

According to the numbers (Salient Studies on the Arts in Education), involvement in the arts makes students more proficient in their other studies. Involvement improves literacy, achievement, attendance, test scores, and graduation rates. But it's not just for kids.

Further study results reveal participation in the arts provides a platform to learn from mistakes, to develop creativity, to be critical thinkers. The arts improve attention, provide motivation, and strengthen communities. What employer doesn't value these attributes in an employee?

The same study also notes that the arts pay dividends. This is the quantifiable aspect of the arts and something we should talk more about.

How do we measure things like building Data reported by Americans for the Arts president and CEO Robert Lynch informs us that the arts and culture industry. Yes, with a B.
