






AMBROSIA & ORLEANS


It's a night of classic rock from the 70s and 80s featuring TWO great bands.

Their music turned the heads and caught the ears of many iconic bands, which led to touring opportunities with groups like Fleetwood Mac, Heart, and the Doobie Brothers. Since their success in the 1970s, Ambrosia has earned five Grammy Nominations, as well as multiple Top 40 singles. Known for their hits "Biggest Part of Me," "How I Feel," and "You're the Only Woman," Ambrosia is sure to bring that same 1970's groove to the Marion Palace Theatre in 2018!




