PBS sensation and classical-crossover artist, Annie Moses Band, wellknown for their fiery string playing and soulful renditions of beloved American songs, are bringing their spectacular show to the Palace on Saturday, January 12th at 8 p.m.

These siblings began training at a young age, first in classical music (their studies took them to the Juilliard School) and then expanded into an astonishing variety of genres including folk, bluegrass, and pop. To aid in the PCAA's education mission initiative, the Palace Theatre has expanded programming to include an exciting new series of Palace Academy of the Arts classes for all ages. With a strong focus on the performing arts, start up classes will be taught by theatre veteran and Palace Academy Director Kristi Wink. Future program expansion plans are in the works to include a selection of visual arts classes along with the current line-up.
