

In some ways, bringing 12 ANGRY JURORS to the stage at the Palace Theatre is not unlike the characters' experience in the jury room. Twelve actors, mostly unknown to each other, spend weeks working together toward one goal – in this case bringing to life the script on the page. Perhaps that is one of the reasons this play has been so popular for more than 60 years. Our cast for this production is a mix of veterans and first-time actors. They have
