



Based on the music from The Carpenters' two holiday albums ("Christmas Portrait" and "An Old-Fashioned Christmas") and Christmas variety shows, this concert aims to spread joy and cheer to all!

A CARPENTERS' CHRISTMAS comes from the creative team behind "Close to You: The Music of the Carpenters," who performed for a full house at the Marion Palace Theatre in 2014. The festive show includes holiday classics such as "I'll Be Home for Christmas," "Santa Claus is Coming to Town," "The Christmas Song," "Jingle Bells," "Silent Night," and of course, "Merry Christmas, Darling" among others. 
