

FROM THE DIRECTOR'S CHAIR

WORKING TO PRESERVE & PROMOTE THE HISTORIC PALACE THEATRE BEV FORD, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

When is a building more than a building? When it's the Marion Palace Theatre!

These four walls have done much more than hold up the Theatre's beautiful, midnight blue, sky-like, domed ceiling.

Built by renowned theatre architect John Eberson back in 1928, the Palace was one of just over 100 atmospheric-designed theatre's built by the flamboyant Eberson. Today, as one of only 16 remaining operational atmospherics, the Palace is a testimony to the unique ability of a building to transport visitors to another place and time. Hundreds of thousands of guests over the past 91 years have experienced just that.

Over the past several years, the Palace Board of Directors and staff have worked diligently to preserve and promote the historic Palace Theatre.

This work has always been possible because of the generosity of those in this community who believe this fine theatre to be more than just a building. The



Marion Palace Theatre is a treasure to be cherished and preserved, and Marion residents, along with guests from near and far, have proven to truly love and value this historic building and all it represents. We are grateful for that.

Our current need is to replace a failing roof, which is the second phase of an overall renovation plan that was initiated six years ago.

In 2013, while preparing to have some interior repair work done, contractors directed our attention to deterioration of the structural steel in the front of the building and some exterior conditions that needed addressed for the building's preservation. With guidance from structural engineers and input from the State, addressing the structural steel was priority one, with renovation of the roof to come later.

The Palace roof was last replaced in the 1990s. We looked to roofing experts who suggested a maintenance plan to extend the life of the current roof until the reroof could be addressed. The roof is now priority.

This phase includes tearing off the roof down to the roof decking, replacing what needs replaced, and then applying a new roof. This will provide new roofing on all of the historic building's roof surfaces.

The project also includes repairs to the



exterior walls such as tuck pointing and sealing the brick, replacing steel lintels, flashings, copings, and broken terra cotta along with new ladders and roof vents.

We are fortunate to have skilled board members and community members leading this charge. The Capital Maintenance Committee, comprised of Chairman Tom Schifer, Jeff Baldauf, Scott Ruth, Dave Strzalka, and John Keggan, is overseeing the project.

Under the direction of Honorary Chair John Keggan and Campaign Chair Sue Jacob, we have launched the "Rai\$e the **Roof"** campaign to fund the project. This campaign includes working with our State Representative Tracy Richardson to request funds from Ohio's Capital Budget. We have requested half of the projected \$1.1M project. If we receive those funds, we must match them dollar for dollar.

This Theatre's role in our community is the inspiration behind this challenge.

If these "Spanish courtyard" walls could

talk, they would tell stories by the hundreds of life changing experiences for those who have taken the stage and life enriching encounters for those who have filled these auditorium seats.

Thousands upon thousands have enjoyed activities of all kinds here at the Palace.

Each year, dozens of children have taken the stage to be "bit by the bug" of theatre. It has been life changing for them as they grew in self-confidence, stage presence, ability, and relationship. Many returned year after year; growing up on this very stage to journey to other stages.

The Palace has served as the community's meeting space for all of life's moments. Families and friends have said their final good-byes to those they cherished more than life itself. The Theatre has hosted thousands of graduates as they walk across the stage and into their individual journeys. There are tales of first kisses and popping the question of a lifetime, "Will you marry me?" And enthusiastically, amid hugs

and kisses, the answer was a resounding, "YES!"

We have grown to appreciate the faithful resounding "YES!" we have received from this community when the Palace has had planned and emergency capital improvement needs.
